On behalf of all of us here at The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA), welcome to the 2011 racing season.

Off track and on, 2010 was a memorable year for New York racing.

In October, the ground was officially broken at Aqueduct Racetrack for the long-awaited casino. Operated by the global tourism and entertainment company Genting, Resorts World New York and its 4,525 VLTs are projected to generate substantial gross gaming revenue. Along with supporting education in the state, the revenue will give New York's thoroughbred industry a financial boost and long-term economic stability.

In December, New York City OTB shut down its operations. While the loss of our single largest revenue provider was a significant blow, it also provided us with the opportunity to change the landscape of racing in New York and we quickly moved to fill the void. Given approval from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, NYRA began live streaming races on its website, NYRARewards.com; expanded its NYRA Rewards account wagering platform to allow for instant signup and online funding, and opened the Belmont Café simulcast center at Belmont Park, which within days was handling more than any other single off-track betting facility in the New York area.

As 2011 began, on-track wagering and attendance continued to increase dramatically and we anticipate our ADW revenue will be greater than all five of New York's remaining off-track betting entities combined this year.

On track, Saratoga, Belmont Park and Aqueduct once again were the stages for a myriad of 2010 champions, both equine and human. Eclipse Award winners Uncle Mo (Top 2-Year-Old Male), Gio Ponti (Top Turf Male), Ramon Dominguez (Outstanding Jockey) and Todd Pletcher (Outstanding Trainer) were based in New York, with Older Male champion Blame and 3-Year-Old Filly champion Blind Luck turning in superlative efforts at Saratoga in winning the Grade 1 Whitney and the Grade 1 Alabama, respectively. WinStar Farm (Outstanding Owner) gained its second classic win of 2010 as Drosselmeyer took the 142nd running of the Belmont Stakes, and Saratoga's own Marylou Whitney was the recipient of an Eclipse Award of Merit for a lifetime of contributions to the sport.

We hope you enjoy the 2011 Media Guide and the history within. The roots of New York racing go back more than a century and we are committed to seeing it grow in the years ahead.

A History of The New York Racing Association

Created more than 50 years ago so that New York State could share in the boom in racing that followed World War II, The New York Racing Association, Inc., holds the exclusive right to conduct racing at Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga until 2033.

NYRA's beginnings date back to 1955, when the Greater New York Association acquired the assets of the four racing associations operating Belmont, Jamaica, Saratoga and Aqueduct racetracks.

Within four years, the NYRA had demolished the old Aqueduct and in 1959 opened the modern Aqueduct. Jamaica Race Track was closed down the same year and its property sold for use as a housing development. From 1963 through 1968, Belmont Park was shuttered as a new grandstand was built.

In 2010, a new era began at Aqueduct Race-track as construction began on Resorts World New York. The long-awaited casino, operated by Genting New York LLC, is expected to generate substantial revenue that will help support education in the state as well as ensuring long-term stability for the racing industry.

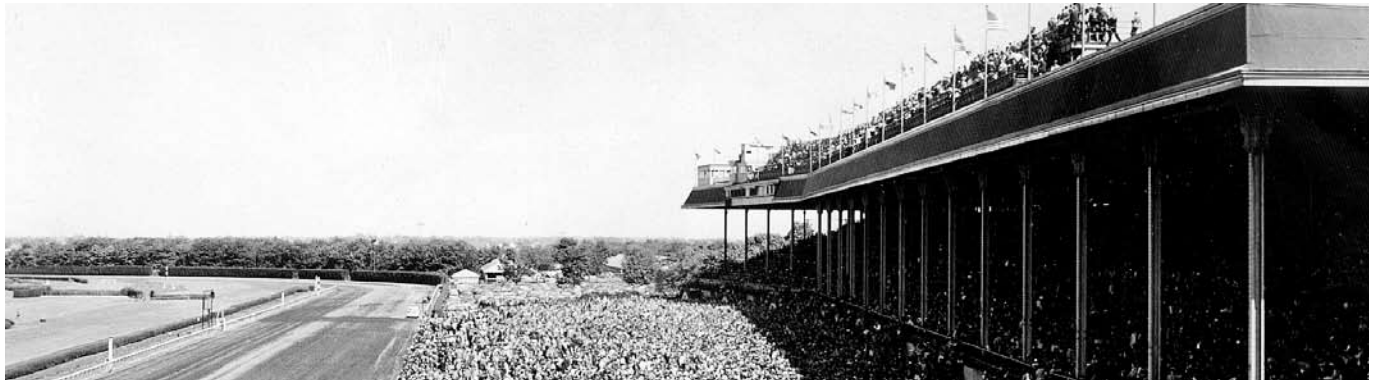
NYRA tracks are the cornerstone of the state's thoroughbred business, which contributes more than \$2 billion annually to New York State's urban, suburban and rural economy.

In 2010, more than 1.6 million people attended the live races at NYRA tracks. Factoring in nationwide off-track wagering, the average daily betting handle on NYRA races totals more than \$8.7 million.

C. STEVEN DUNCKER

C. Steven Duncker is the Chairman of The New York Racing Association, Inc. In 2003, Mr. Duncker was elected Vice Chairman of the Board and Co-Chief Operating Officer of NYRA. Prior to being elected Vice Chairman, Mr. Duncker served on the Board since 1999.

In 1980, Mr. Duncker graduated Cum Laude from Duke University and attended the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management, Northwestern University, where he received his MM, Finance in 1982. Immediately following, Mr. Duncker was hired by Goldman Sachs & Company, where he first worked in St. Louis, then Chicago. Mr. Duncker moved to New York and became Vice President in 1986 and was named Partner in 1996. In 2001, Mr. Duncker retired as Partner after successfully running the Global Credit Derivative Department.

Boards on which Mr. Duncker serves include the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association, The Jockey Club Information Systems and Equibase, Inc. He is the Founder and Trustee of the C. Steven Duncker Foundation, which is dedicated to providing educational opportunities to disadvantaged children. Other charitable affiliations include The Jockey Club Foundation, which is dedicated to helping the disadvantaged in the racing industry.

Mr. Duncker is an avid thoroughbred owner and breeder racing in New York, New Jersey, Kentucky and Florida.

Mr. Duncker and his wife, Melinda, son, Teddy, and daughter, Haley Elle, reside in Palm Beach, FL and Saratoga Springs, NY.



CHARLES E. HAYWARD

Charles E. Hayward was appointed to his current position as President and CEO of The New York Racing Association, Inc. in November of 2004.

Graduated Cum Laude from Bowdoin College, Mr. Hayward is a current resident of Manhattan and Saratoga Springs, NY, and is married to Manhattan art gallery owner Betsy Senior.

Hayward is former President and CEO of the Daily Racing Form and before that was the President and CEO of Little, Brown Publishing.

He also held executive roles in Simon & Schuster Publishers, HP Books and MacMillan Publishing.

Mr. Hayward currently serves on the Boards of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, Thoroughbred Racing Association and on the NYRA Board, as he previously did from 1995 to 1999.

Mr. Hayward has been a horse racing fan for more than 30 years and a thoroughbred owner for the last decade.



HAROLD G. HANDEL

Harold G. Handel was appointed to his current position as Executive Vice President and COO of The New York Racing Association, Inc. in September of 2007.

Mr. Handel is a current resident of Cranbury, NJ and Manhattan along with his wife Sheila. After graduating from Rutgers, he then received his J.D. from Seton Hall University Law School. The following year, he became Deputy Attorney General (DAG) for the State of New Jersey Organized Crime & Special Prosecutions Unit, then DAG and Counsel for the New Jersey Rac-

ing Commission. Mr. Handel then joined Monmouth Park and New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority where he held executive roles for 12 years. After seven years serving as Executive Vice President and COO at Monmouth Park, he accepted the role of CEO for Greenwood Racing in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Handel has previously served as Chairman of the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, President of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, and Trustee of the American Horse Council. He is currently on the Board of the TRA and Equibase.



NYRA: ON-AIR

In 2011, the Grade 1, \$1 million Belmont Stakes was reunited with the first two jewels of the Triple Crown on NBC, the network which had previously shown the “Test of the Champion” from 2001-2005. The deal includes additional Belmont Stakes Day coverage on VERSUS.

“We are thrilled to return our premier race to NBC Sports,” said NYRA Chairman C. Steven Duncker. “They have done a terrific job covering horse racing, including their Kentucky Derby and the Preakness broadcasts over the prior decade. With an excellent production team that has pioneered innovative camera angles, and a tremendous group of on-air talent that offers unique insights into the races, NBC Sports will be a great partner for the Belmont Stakes.”

NYRA expanded its television operations following the closure of NYCOTB in December, 2010. Racing fans can tune in to Channel 71 on Time Warner – the former home of the NYCOTB Racing Network – to watch the NYRA Network, which features live coverage of NYRA racing. Following the NYRA races, the channel highlights select simulcast signals from around the country, with coverage ending with the conclusion of racing at Yonkers Raceway. On dark days, NYRA broadcasts The NYRA Network Presents Raceday, which airs from noon – 6 p.m. and spotlights simulcast racing from around the country.

The NYRA Network is also the home of The National Racing Report, which on Saturdays previews upcoming stakes races in North America and on Wednesdays recaps the previous week’s stakes action. On holiday weeks with live racing Monday at NYRA tracks, the recap show usually airs on Thursday instead of Wednesday.

In addition to the coverage on the NYRA Network, MSG Plus currently telecasts “Aqueduct/Belmont Park/Saratoga in 30,” a daily half-hour race-replay show, and “Thoroughbred Weekly,” a weekly half-hour show which includes timely features and races of the week.

NYRA Rewards account holders can also watch live video streams from Aqueduct, Belmont, Saratoga, and many other tracks in North America at NYRARewards.com. The free service returns the largest rebates among all account wagering platforms based in the United States and allows horseplayers to earn cash back for wagers made on track, through the NYRA Rewards telephone service, on mobile devices, and on the NYRA Rewards website.



NYRA: ONLINE

Fully committed to offering fans an interactive and cutting edge experience, NYRA was one of the first horse racing organizations to embrace social media and maintains a robust presence on Facebook, Twitter and Flickr in addition to its official YouTube channel, YouTube.com/nyraveideo.

With a library of more than 500 videos, ranging from stakes replays to handicapping shows to behind-the-scenes features with racing's brightest stars and interviews with jockeys and trainers, NYRA's YouTube channel is unparalleled in its depth and variety.

Continuing to expand its presence on the internet, in December of 2010 NYRA began offering a live video stream of its races in addition to races from tracks around the country to NYRA Rewards members at NYRARewards.com. Also, "The National Racing Report" on Saturday and Wednesday mornings, and "Talking Horses" on live race days are streamed at NYRA.com.

Among other online activities, fans can participate in web chats with Andy Serling and guest hosts on selected Thursday and Friday nights at nyra.com/livechat, obtain expert pedigree and sales analysis for select debuting 2-year-olds at Forbes' Firsters (nyra.com/firsters), read about impressive maiden winners at the New York Watch site (nyra.com/nywatch), and get complete coverage of the Belmont Stakes at BelmontStakes.com, which is dedicated to the prestigious third jewel of thoroughbred racing's Triple Crown. MULTIDIMENSIONAL MIG

A familiar face in the NYRA jockey colony transitions to a new role in 2011



With 4,450 career winners, retired jockey Richard Migliore knows a thing or two about race riding and will bring that experience to bear in new roles at NYRA, where he will serve as a broadcast analyst and racing office associate.

As a broadcast analyst, Migliore will appear on a variety of NYRA TV program offerings. In support of the racing office, the 46-year old New York native will participate in the Apprentice Program, working with apprentice jockeys on riding skills, race strategies, and safe riding practices. Migliore will also help conduct seminars for new and prospective thoroughbred owners to encourage broader participation in the industry, and appear at various local events in support of NYRA's community outreach programs.

Born and raised on Long Island, Migliore got a job on a horse farm near his home and decided upon a career as a jockey at age 12. He began riding in 1980, and in 1981 won the Eclipse Award as the nation's top apprentice with 298 victories. Twice the leading rider in New York – in 1981 and 1985 – Migliore won or tied as leading rider at 10 different NYRA meets, most recently taking the 2005 Aqueduct spring meet.

A fixture on the NYRA circuit for three decades, Migliore was injured in a spill at Aqueduct last January and announced his retirement on June 2, 2010. "The Mig," as he was known, rode more than 30,000 horses over the course of his career, the earners of \$160,205,725 in purse money. Migliore piloted the winners of 362 stakes, including 25 Grade 1 races, and enjoyed several major victories toward the end of his career, taking his first Breeders' Cup race in 2008 aboard Turf Sprint winner Desert Code, and capturing the Grade 1 Gazelle and Grade 1 Test aboard Flashing in 2009.

TOM DURKIN: THE VOICE OF NYRA

NYRA track announcer Tom Durkin has been bringing his special brand of excitement to race fans at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga since 1990. Durkin, who calls the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, is the voice of the Belmont Stakes and through the years has chronicled the Triple Crown series with knowledge, wit and a keen sense of drama.

Voted "Best Announcer" in the *Thoroughbred Times'* "Best of 2008" voting, Durkin is also a popular TV voice on important stakes races beyond the Triple Crown. A native of Chicago, he studied theatre at St. Norbert College and began calling races at county fairs in Wisconsin in the early 1970s. Including the Breeders' Cup, which he called from its inception in 1984 through 2005, Durkin has called races at more than 50 tracks in six countries.





NYRA AND THE COMMUNITY

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) is committed to upholding the ideals of community service and support, both within thoroughbred racing and in the communities surrounding Aqueduct Racetrack, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course.

NYRA leadership is visibly committed to good corporate citizenship: Chairman C. Steven Duncker is the Founder and Trustee of the C. Steven Duncker Foundation, which is dedicated to providing educational opportunities to disadvantaged children.

In 2010, President and CEO Charles Hayward accepted a number of awards and honors in recognition of NYRA's community outreach initiatives. In December, he was honored by the Village of Floral Park and presented with a citation from the Village for NYRA's generosity, hospitality, community relations and community outreach. Hayward also was honored by Nassau County, the Town of Hempstead, the Elmont Chamber of Commerce and the Nassau Council of Chambers of Commerce for his outstanding leadership in the community.

In December, Hayward was proud to welcome back Major Chuck Kilbride and the U.S. Marine Corps as they returned to Aqueduct Racetrack for the Annual Toys for Tots Campaign. NYRA matched all financial donations made by trainers and owners to the drive with more than \$20,000 raised.

At Saratoga Race Course, NYRA offers the Community Outreach Booth, which provides local charities and organizations the opportunity to provide information about their mission and raise much-needed funds. NYRA also donates the Community Outreach Box in the clubhouse for the entire Saratoga season, which gives groups an additional opportunity to raise funds through charity auctions.

2010 Year in Review

Some of North America's most promising juveniles, eight eventual Breeders' Cup winners, and the Eclipse Award winners for Outstanding Jockey and Outstanding Trainer all played starring roles on the NYRA stage in 2010.

Three of the four Breeders' Cup races for 2-year-olds were won by horses who had competed in New York in 2010. More Than Real, who launched her career at Saratoga Race Course, rallied to defeat Miss Grillo winner Winter Memories in the Juvenile Fillies Turf. The following day, Pluck, who had broken his maiden at Belmont Park in July, unleashed a powerful turn of foot to win the Juvenile Turf.

But the brightest juvenile star that weekend at Churchill Downs was Uncle Mo, who capped his unblemished championship season with a resounding 4 1/4-length victory in the Juvenile over Grade 1 Three Chimneys Hopeful hero Boys At Tosconova. Previously, Uncle Mo gave owner Repole Stable its first graded stakes victory when he took the Grade 1 Champagne Stakes in October and turned heads on Travers

Day in August when he debuted a 14 1/4-length winner.

While that group was making headlines at Churchill Downs, To Honor and Serve gained the notice of the racing world with a dominant success in the Grade 2 Nashua at Aqueduct Racetrack. Four weeks later, To Honor and Serve was an easy winner of the Grade 2 Remsen.

The Champion Older Horse, Blame, also raced in New York in 2010, making a determined run to defeat Quality Road by a head in the Grade 1 Whitney at Saratoga. The Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider homebred returned to New York in October to finish second to New York-bred sensation Haynesfield in the Grade 1 Jockey Club Gold Cup, setting up Blame for a narrow victory over previously undefeated Zenyatta in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Other 2010 Breeders' Cup winners who competed on the NYRA circuit include Eldaafer (Marathon), Shared Account (Filly & Mare Turf), Unrivaled Belle (Ladies' Classic), and Big Drama (Sprint).

The Whitney was just one of a number of Grade 1 races at Saratoga Race Course that featured a stirring stretch battle. Turf mare Proviso displayed her grit in the Diana when she prevailed by a head over eventual Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Shared Account and two-time defending race winner Forever Together, while well-traveled Blind Luck used her trademark late run to defeat divisional rival Havre de Grace by a neck in the Alabama, a race that was a major factor in determining Champion 3-Year-Old Filly honors. Meanwhile, the Travers had one of its closest finishes in its 141-year history when Afleet Express skimmed the rail to defeat Fly Down by a nose.

The 142nd running of the Belmont Stakes on June 5 went to Drosselmeyer, giving Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott his first victory in a Triple Crown race. Nine weeks later, Mott became the ninth horseman to have won 4,000 races when he saddled Mystic to a victory in the seventh race at Saratoga on August 7.

History was made over Independence Day weekend when New York-breds swept the three graded stakes at Belmont Park. Haynesfield got things started on Saturday by winning the Suburban, and Franny Freud followed the next day in the Prior-ess. Rightly So, who would go on to win

the Grade 1 Ballerina at Saratoga, completed the sweep with a game victory over Qualia on Monday in the Bed o' Roses.

Jockey Ramon Dominguez had another banner year in New York, securing five of the six NYRA meet titles and his second

straight year-end title by winning 353 races at Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga, en route to receiving his first Eclipse Award for Outstanding Jockey. The native of Caracas, Venezuela, reached a personal milestone at Aqueduct on March 19, picking up his 4,000th career score when he guided Fortyninegeorgest to a half-length victory.

Other notable moments for Dominguez in 2010 included a repeat victory in the Grade 1 Man o' War aboard Champion Male Turf Horse Gio Ponti, triumphs in the Suburban and Grade 1 Jockey Club Gold Cup with Haynesfield, and a success in the Grade 1 Hopeful with Boys At Tosconova.

Trainer Todd Pletcher, who topped the NYRA trainer standings for the third time in his career, captured Aqueduct's marquee race when Eskendereya posted an emphatic 9 3/4-length success in the Wood Memorial, which was voted by fans as NYRA's Race of the Year. Pletcher went on to garner his first victory in the "Run for the Roses" with Super Saver, who had broken his maiden at Belmont the previous September. Back in New York, Pletcher added Grade 1 successes in the Metropolitan Mile and Woodward with Quality Road, the Ogden Phipps Handicap and Beldame with Life At Ten, the Mother Goose and TVG Coaching Club American Oaks with Devil May Care, the Ruffian with Malibu Prayer, the King's Bishop with Discreetly Mine, the Spinaway with R Heat Lightning, and the Champagne with Uncle Mo.

The New York sporting world lost an icon on July 13 when thoroughbred owner and breeder George Steinbrenner, best known as the principal owner of the New York Yankees, died at the age of 80. Less than six weeks after Steinbrenner's death, Position Limit, a daughter of Steinbrenner's 2005 Wood Memorial winner Bellamy Road, took the Adirondack at Saratoga. On New Year's Eve, Edward P. Evans, the owner and breeder of luminaries such as Gygistar, Quality Road, Raging Fever, and Summer Colony, passed away at 68.

AQUEDUCT RACE TRACK

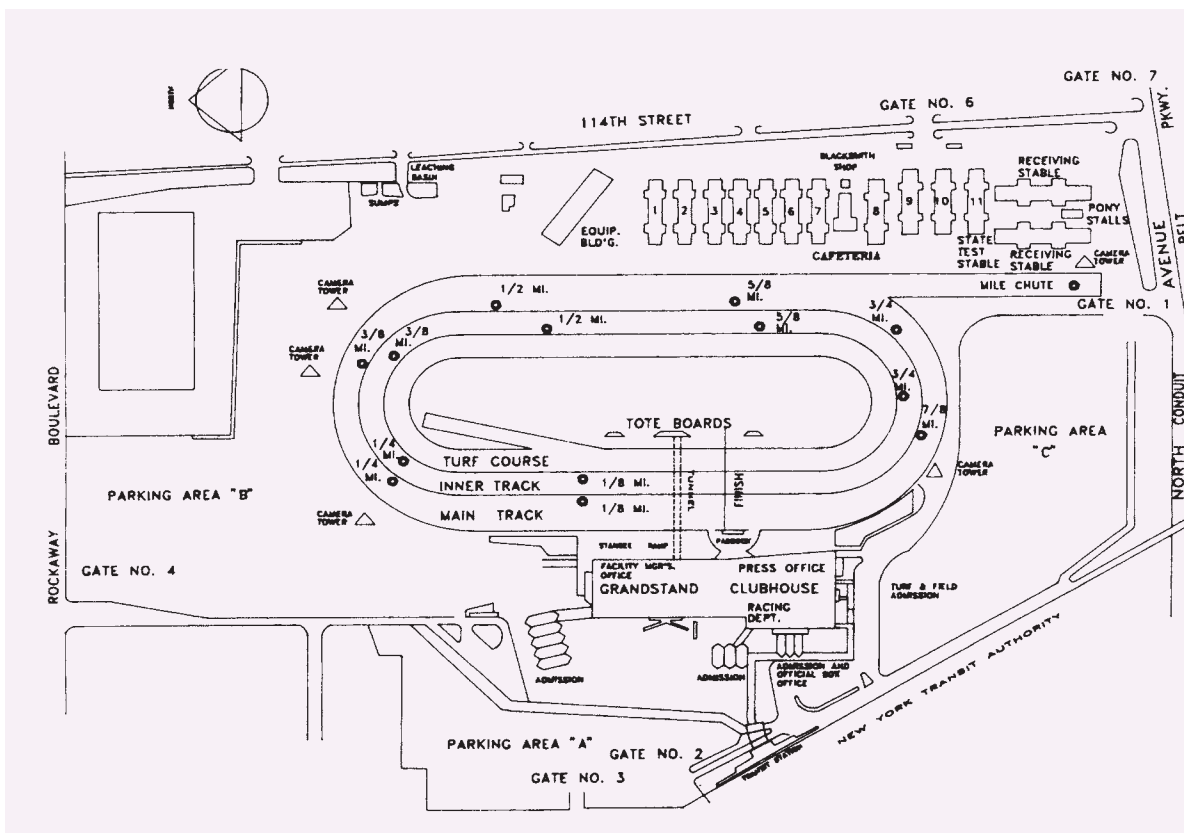
Aqueduct Racetrack opened on September 27, 1894, on property that belonged to the old Brooklyn Water Works, which was home to a conduit that brought water to New York City from the vast Hempstead Plain. Also known as the Big A, Aqueduct is the only racetrack in New York City, occupying 210 acres in South Ozone Park in the borough of Queens. Just eight miles from its sister track, Belmont Park, Aqueduct's neighbor is John F. Kennedy International Airport, the top international passenger gateway in the United States.

Through the years, the Big A has been the scene of some of racing's landmark events, including the only triple dead heat in stakes history when Brownie, Bossuet, and Wait a Bit hit the wire as one in the Carter Handicap on June 10, 1944. Man o' War, Sword Dancer, Kelso, Buckpasser, Dr. Fager, Secretariat, Forego, Easy Goer and Smarty Jones built their legends at Aqueduct, and Cigar, for whom the Grade 1 Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile is named, won the first two races of his 16-race winning streak at the Big A.

From 1955-59, Aqueduct was rebuilt at a cost of \$34.5 million. With a new grandstand, racing strip, barns, and accessory buildings, the new Aqueduct opened on September 14, 1959 to a crowd of 42,473 and rave reviews as the most up-to-date racing facility in North America. From 1963-68, during the reconstruction of Belmont Park, Aqueduct was the site of the Belmont Stakes.

In 1975, Aqueduct opened its winterized, one-mile inner dirt track on the former site of the inner turf course, and on October 11, 1981, it unveiled one of the largest restaurants in New York City, the multi-tiered Equestris. In 1985 and 1989, Aqueduct underwent two more rounds of improvements, including the construction of mini-theatres, the expansion of the backyard, paddock and grandstand and installation of a weather-insulated paddock.

In 2010, Aqueduct commenced its most sweeping change when construction began on a multi-level, 415,000 square foot casino. Resorts World New York, operated by Genting New York LLC, will occupy two floors of the former grandstand and offer more than 4,500 VLTs upon completion.

BELMONT PARK

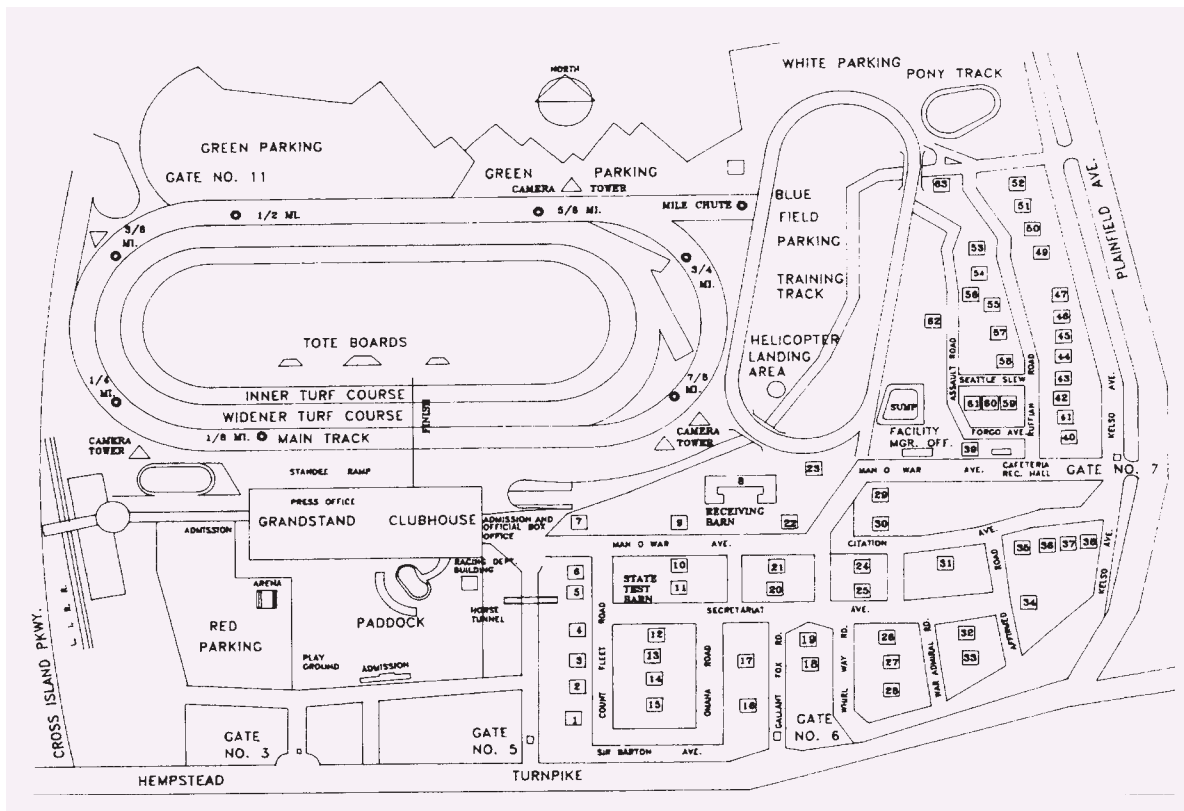
In 1902, a syndicate headed by August Belmont II and former Secretary of the Navy William C. Whitney sought land on Long Island to build the most elaborate track in America, one modeled after the great race courses of Europe. They found what they were looking for on the border of Queens County and Nassau County. Originally known as Foster's Meadow, the 650 acres of land included a turreted Tudor-Gothic mansion owned by William de Forest Manice, which was to serve as the track's Turf and Field Club until 1956.

The grand opening of Belmont Park on May 4, 1905, prompted the first of countless traffic jams in Long Island history as more than 40,000 fans, in all manner of conveyance, tried to arrive by the first race post time of 3 p.m. Not all of them made it in time to see August Belmont II's Blandy, at 7-1, hold off 100-1 shot Oliver Cromwell in the \$1,500 Belmont Inaugural. Later, James R. Keen's Sysonby, who would be ranked No. 30 on the Blood-Horse Magazine's top 100 horses of the 20th century, made his 3-year-old debut against the super filly Beldame, another of Belmont's charges. In the stretch, Sysonby got unexpected competition from 20-1 Race King, and the two hit the wire in a dead heat.

The most celebrated race at Belmont Park is the Belmont Stakes, the final jewel of racing's Triple Crown. Since 1919, when Sir Barton was the first to sweep the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness and the Belmont, the "Test of the Champion" has crowned but 11 winners of racing's most prestigious, and elusive, prize.

Belmont Park holds a place in history in other areas as well. In 1910, Wilbur and Orville Wright staged an international aerial competition at Belmont Park that drew 150,000 spectators. In 1918, the track served as the New York City terminal for the first airmail service between New York and Washington, D.C. Belmont Park was the site of "War Relief Day" in 1940 to benefit the American Red Cross and in 1943 hosted "Back the Attack" Day, wherein fans had to buy a war bond to gain admission to the track. Total receipts that day were between \$25 and \$30 million.

Closed in 1963, the rebuilt Belmont Park grandstand reopened on May 20, 1968. Over the next decade it rocked to the cheers of thousands as Secretariat (1973), Seattle Slew (1977) and Affirmed (1978) joined Sir Barton (1919), Gallant Fox (1930), Omaha (1935), War Admiral (1937), Whirlaway (1941), Count Fleet (1943), Assault (1946), and Citation (1948) as Triple Crown winners. History was made in 2007 when Rags to Riches defeated Curlin to become the first filly in 102 years and one of only three to win the race, and history was denied in 2008 when Da' Tara ended Big Brown's bid to sweep the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont.

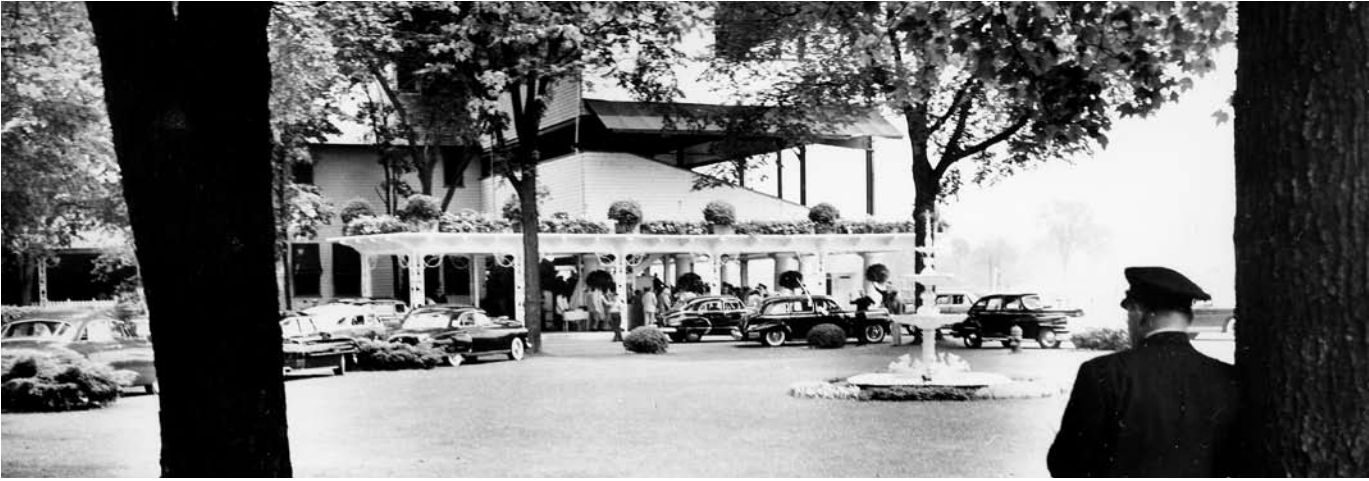

SARATOGA RACE COURSE

Thoroughbred racing has no finer setting than Saratoga Race Course, named one of the world's greatest sporting venues by *Sports Illustrated*. Every summer, the past comes alive in the historic grandstand as fans experience not only the best in racing, but the unmatched ambience and charm of historic Saratoga Springs.

Already famous for its mineral baths, Saratoga held its first thoroughbred meet just a month after the Battle of Gettysburg. Staged by gambler, casino owner, ex-boxing champion and future Congressman John "Old Smoke" Morrissey and beginning on August 3, 1863, the four-day meet drew thousands of locals and tourists who saw Lizzie W. defeat Captain Moore in the best-of-three series of races.

Emboldened by the success of that first meet, Morrissey promptly enlisted his friends John R. Hunter, William Travers and Leonard Jerome to form the Saratoga Association. Its first responsibility was the construction of a new, permanent grandstand on the current site of Saratoga Race Course. Across the street, the "old course" became the barn area known as Horse Haven, with the vestiges of the original track still encircling the stables.

Today, looking out over the jam-packed backyard and grandstand on any sunny summer afternoon, it's hard to fathom that racing at Saratoga once teetered on the brink of extinction. In the early 1960's, there was a movement to conduct summer racing exclusively at the new and modern Aqueduct Racetrack. But in 1962, New York State Governor W. Averill Harriman, who owned Log Cabin Stud, signed "The Harriman Law," which mandated a minimum of 24 race days at Saratoga every year.

Nowadays, the population of Saratoga Springs triples to 75,000 when the thoroughbreds return each summer, with those who come for the races discovering the area's amazing breadth of history and culture.

With more than 1,000 buildings on the National Register of Historic Places, Saratoga Springs was honored with the first American Heritage Magazine "Great American Place" award and the National Trust for Historic Places' "Great American Main Street" award. *Walking Magazine* cited it as one of America's "Most Walkable Cities."

Saratoga Springs is home to the National Museum of Racing, the Saratoga Performing Arts Center (SPAC), the National Museum of the Dance, Skidmore College, and many art galleries. Resplendent in Victorian architecture, it also boasts Yaddo Rose Gardens, the Little Theatre at SPAC, the Saratoga Music Hall and the Foundation for Baroque Music. Nearby, Saratoga Battlefield in Stillwater is dedicated to "The Turning Point of the American Revolution," while Ulysses S. Grant's Cottage at Mt. McGregor is where the bankrupt former president and Civil War hero, wrote his memoirs and restored his family's fortune.

Although some may quibble with the order, it's no wonder that Saratoga's motto is "Health, history, and horses."

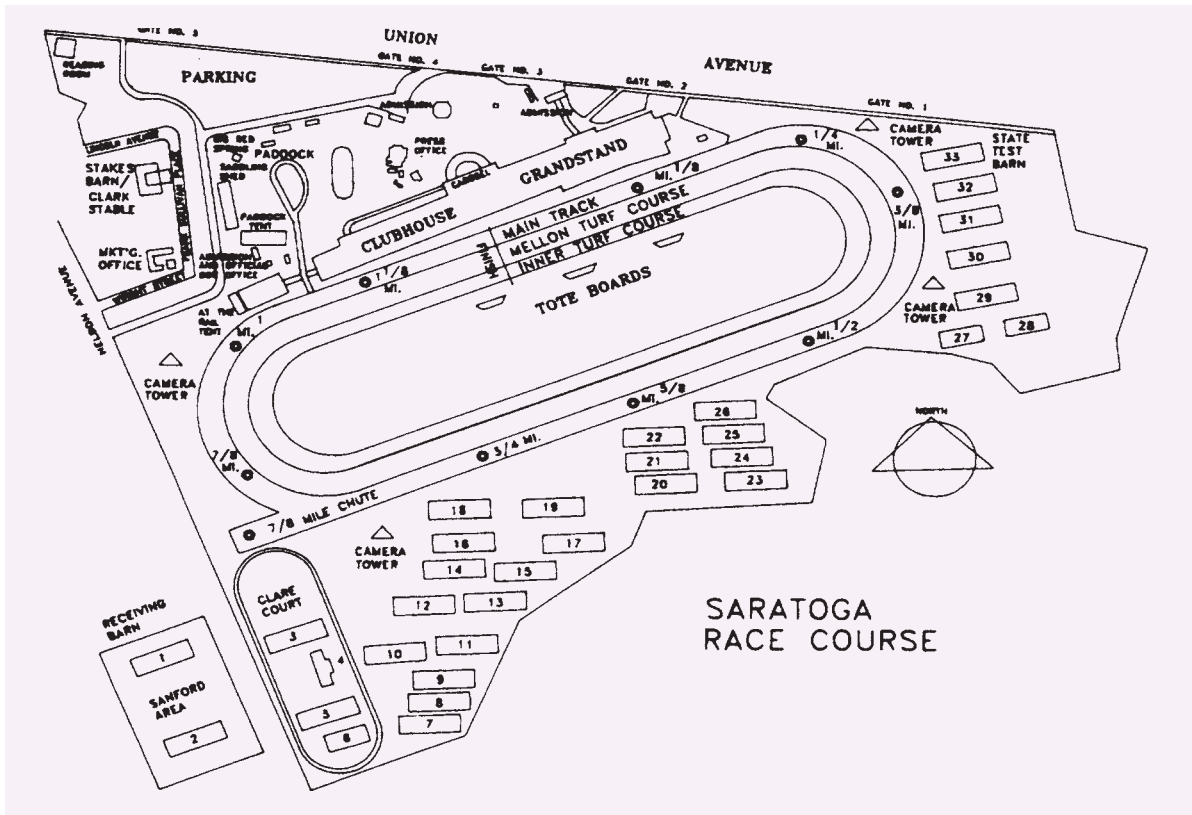

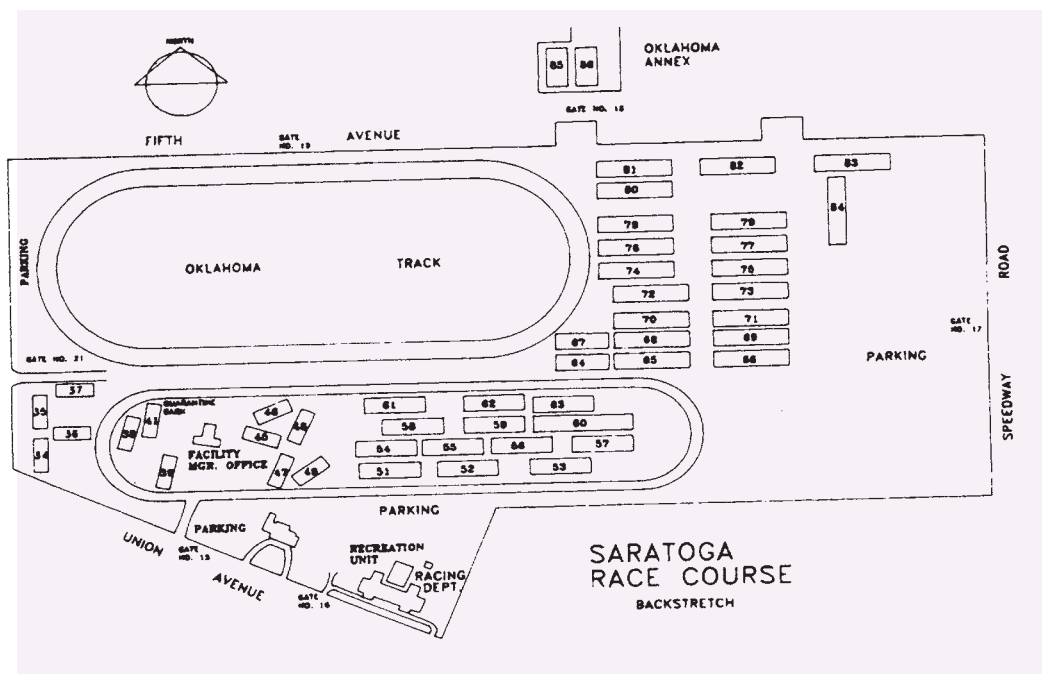
